General Terms

The supplier's responsibility is to keep the company informed about any changes affecting the quality of the product/service provided or the requirements related to health and safety and fire protection, Environmental and Climate Protection, the Code of Ethics of the Electropoli Group and other requirements (including legal requirements).

Each supplier is obliged to maintain confidentiality towards Electropoli as well as to provide a signed document "Electropoli NDA PL-EN" (Non-Disclosure Agreement).

The supplier of products, processes or services must guarantee to Electropoli its ability to carry out the product or service in accordance with all specifications and the expected quantitative level, guaranteeing the efficiency of the production processes or services.

The Supplier is obliged to send invoices by e-mail to the following address: cz.faktury@electropoli.com and to include the order number or contract number on the basis of which the invoice was issued on each invoice issued to Electropoli Czech Republic, s.r.o. unless Electropoli decides otherwise.

Supplier Quality Assurance Agreement

In order to qualify a supplier by Electropoli, the supplier is required to accept and sign Supplier Quality Assurance Agreement which constitutes Annex No. 1 to Supplier Specific Requirements.

Environmental Protection and Climate

Electropoli is constantly striving to reduce the environmental and climate impact of its operations. As such, it requires its suppliers to support its commitment to mitigating climate change, protecting the environment, including biodiversity, and protecting natural resources.

Electropoli expects suppliers to conduct their business in a low-carbon and environmentally sustainable manner. In addition, it expects the goods and services to be produced in a resource-efficient manner and to meet the requirements covered by all relevant laws and conventions. Suppliers are expected to carry out ongoing environmental due diligence to identify, assess and determine potential risks in order to prevent, mitigate and mitigate negative impacts on the climate, biodiversity and natural resources.

In particular, the following are expected:

- reporting and monitoring of greenhouse gas emissions;
- energy management, energy efficiency and the use of energy from low-carbon and renewable sources;
- management of water resources, including monitoring of their quantity and quality;

- monitoring and ensuring adequate air quality,
- prevention of pollution of water, air and soil;
- implementation of the principles of the circular economy,
- receiving, reusing and recycling waste;
- protection of biodiversity, ecosystems, flora and fauna, including appropriate land management and combating deforestation;
- reducing noise emissions and preventing odour nuisance.

For the work carried out on the premises of Electropoli, the environmental requirements must comply with the ISO 14001 standards applied by Electropoli and the general environmental requirements for suppliers. Electropoli has implemented and applies an Environmental Management System in accordance with ISO 14001 and requires that those providing services to Electropoli comply with Electropoli's procedures in this regard, in particular:

- waste segregation - waste should be placed only in appropriately marked waste containers located in the plant hall,
- all other waste generated as a result of works carried out on the premises of Electropoli Czech Republic, s.r.o. by external companies may not be left on the premises of the company, but must be taken away by the contractor of these works for disposal or other management,
- prohibition of pouring any substances into the sewage system,
- motor vehicles used in Electropoli must be in good technical condition so as not to pose a threat to the environment, the engines of these vehicles must be switched off when stationary.

Responsible Sourcing and Material Compliance

As a company, we are committed to sourcing minerals responsibly and minimizing the negative impact of hazardous substances on the environment and human health.

At Electropoli, we are determined to comply with legal requirements and customer-specific requirements regarding prohibitions and restrictions on substances, including hazardous substances, and responsible sourcing of minerals. Therefore, suppliers should ensure that the goods delivered to Electropoli meet the requirements covered by all relevant laws and conventions. In particular, this includes:

- Comply with the list of prohibited and restricted substances and, as agreed, declare any substances contained in the products supplied.
- Exercise due diligence to investigate the source of any minerals from high-risk and conflict-affected areas (conflict materials), as well as other restricted minerals used in products supplied to Electropoli.

As a responsible enterprise, we expect our suppliers to comply with all mandatory due diligence laws and regulations regarding mineral and material

compliance, including tracking and preparing for future regulations and regulations.

Electropoli expects the supplier to provide the relevant declarations or statement upon request.

The Supplier acknowledges that it has read the Electropoli Group's Conflict Minerals Policy on the Electropoli website and undertakes to implement and comply with it.

Code of Conduct

Each of Electropoli's suppliers and subcontractors must comply with the principles of the Electropoli Group's Code of Ethics on the company's website, which includes, i.a. human rights, fair employment conditions and business ethics, paying particular attention to:

- respect for the dignity, privacy and rights of every human being;
- prohibit behaviour, including gestures, language, or physical contact of a sexual nature, coercion, threats, insults, or exploitation;
- deterring discrimination in employment;
- prohibition of child labour at work, in accordance with applicable laws and regulations;
- prohibiting forced labour and allowing workers to terminate their employment relationships freely after an appropriate period of notice;
- fair remuneration of employees and compliance with remuneration laws and regulations;
- rules and regulations regarding working hours, including the overtime limit;
- respecting workers' rights to freedom of association and collective bargaining;
- to refrain from all forms of corruption, extortion and bribery;
- respecting the intellectual property of other parties, including Electropoli;
- comply with international trade and export control laws and regulations.

Development and supervision

Electropoli is committed to continuous improvement of itself and its suppliers based on the available methods. Development and supervision methods include all activities that monitor and improve standards and processes at suppliers, including process audit in accordance with the "VDA 6.3" manual, simplified form of "Line Review", visits to the supplier's site, etc.

Occupational Health and Safety and Fire Protection

Introduction

The main goal and priority of Electropoli CZ is the satisfaction of its customers. Given that the quality of input materials, components and services directly impacts the quality of the products manufactured by Electropoli CZ, the following three basic criteria (in order of importance) are applied to purchasing process:

1. Quality Assurance
2. Compliance with general purchasing requirements
3. Price acceptability

This agreement specifies Electropoli CZ current quality assurance requirements for deliveries from all of its suppliers. The provisions of this agreement are based on international quality management standards, in particular ISO 9001 and IATF 16949, and environmental standards in accordance with ISO 14001.

Purpose of Agreement

The purpose of this agreement is to specify the quality requirements binding for all Electropoli CZ suppliers. Furthermore, it aims to identify all procedures, methods and processes required of suppliers to ensure the quality of all purchased raw materials, components and other services.

At the same time, the agreement should promote the sharing of quality commitments between the Parties, the improvement of finished products quality and the reduction of their negative impact on the environment.

Scope of Application

This agreement is applicable to:

- all customer sites,
- all customer suppliers,
- all types of products and services

Validity of Agreement

This agreement shall enter into force on the date of its signature by both Parties and shall be concluded for an indefinite period. The agreement will cease to be valid upon the signature of a new agreement by both Parties. Either Party may submit request for changes or amendments to this agreement. Any change, amendment or supplement to this agreement shall be agreed in writing and confirmed by both Parties. The notice period is 3 months. However, the validity of the contract remains unaffected for all deliveries ordered prior to the termination of this Supplier Quality Assurance Agreement.

Quality Management System

The basic requirement of Electropoli CZ for all its suppliers is the establishment and effective use of Quality Management System (QMS) according to ISO 9001 or its equivalent. Priority is given to the suppliers certified according to additional specific QMS standards (e.g. IATF 16949, VDA 6, ISO 14001). All suppliers shall submit the QMS documentation through an accredited certification company. A copy of valid certification must be submitted to Electropoli CZ (new certificate is to be sent to the Electropoli CZ Purchasing Department). The supplier shall notify Electropoli CZ no later than 3 months before the expiration of the certificate without the planned renewal. The Supplier shall also notify Electropoli CZ within 24 hours about the rejection of certification.

Suppliers not certified according to ISO 9001 as of the date of this agreement entering into force shall submit a clear certification plan together with the expected implementation date. Non-certified suppliers shall allow Electropoli CZ representatives to verify that the supplier procedures ensure the required product quality (by performing process/system audit) or submit the positive audit report issued by another certified company/final car manufacturer.

Suppliers shall supply products complying with the technical acceptance criteria approved by the customer.

Audits

Electropoli CZ has the right, subject to prior agreement, to perform audits at the Supplier's or its subcontractors' manufacturing site, if appropriate, in the presence of Electropoli CZ customer. The audit may be performed as system audit, product audit or process audit, and shall be agreed in due time before the scheduled date.

Electropoli CZ reserves the right to audit the quality assurance system at the Supplier's or its subcontractors' manufacturing site through contractual or appointed third parties (e.g. Notified Bodies, public authorities). Supplier shall provide access to all documents regarding products/processes or quality management.

Subcontractor Quality Management System

If the Supplier purchases products or services from subcontractors, it shall oblige its subcontractors to comply with the Electropoli CZ supplier requirements. However, this does not relieve the Supplier of liability towards Electropoli CZ for the quality of the products or services provided by its subcontractors.

Risk Analysis and Emergency Preparedness

Supplier shall perform the process risk assessment to avoid threat to delivery or product quality for its customers. As a proof of this analysis, the Supplier may be required to submit an emergency plan.

Supplier Evaluation

Electropoli CZ regularly evaluates the performance of its suppliers in the areas described below and informs suppliers once a year, retroactively, of the results for the previous year.

Evaluation areas:

- a) % of compliant deliveries
- b) complaint scorecard
- c) meeting delivery schedule
- d) communication/flexibility/corrective actions
- e) number of additional transport costs
- f) quality management system
- g) environment

The final evaluation is classified in groups A, B or C. In the case of classification other than "A", the Supplier shall send a written response including the corrective measures taken to improve the quality within the given timeframe. Supplier classified in group C is unqualified for Electropoli CZ and if interested in further cooperation, such evaluation requires performance of supplier audit.

Objectives

The following objectives apply to all products supplied by the Supplier to Electropoli CZ. The Supplier shall require compliance with these objectives from its subcontractors.

% of compliant deliveries	≥ 99%
meeting delivery schedule	≥ 95 %

Environment/sustainability

In accordance with the general development of the company, Electropoli CZ is interested in short-term and long-term activities focused on environmental and social sustainability.

We expect our suppliers to act in an environmentally responsible manner throughout the process chain, preferably in accordance with ISO 14001. The goal is to achieve sustainability and develop environmentally friendly products and processes (minimisation of environmental impacts throughout the life cycle, waste reduction) that enable efficient use of energy, supplies and material resources, resulting in long-term cost reductions.

All products and processes must be developed to prevent environmental or health damage and to optimize resource use. We expect our suppliers to proactively seek targeted solutions for these environmental challenges.

The main goal of our supplying organizations must be to prevent waste and ensure compliance with relevant environmental and safety regulations.

The packaging concept and design of our supplier must be created with the aim to reduce or prevent the non-recycled or non-reusable packaging materials.

Legal Compliance

The Supplier must be familiar with all applicable international, European and national laws, regulations and directives of the exporting country, the importing country and the final destination country that the customer specifies; the Supplier must understand and fully comply with these laws and regulations. This also applies to ethical principles. Electropoli CZ expects suppliers to respect social rights (freedom of association, non-discrimination, free choice of employment, non-use of child labour, fair pay, working times, safety and health at work).

Documentation and Information

Upon request, the Supplier will provide Electropoli CZ with access to quality documentation.

Documentation

Electropoli CZ expects its suppliers to maintain a system of documentation and record keeping on product quality with minimum retention time in accordance with legal and customer specific requirements. The Supplier shall ensure that all archived information is available throughout their retention/archiving period and that the necessary capability and infrastructure for their processing and provision is maintained throughout this period. Electropoli CZ reserves the right to request access to these documents at any time during the retention period.

Electropoli CZ supplier audits include review of record management procedures. If the Supplier becomes insolvent or the company ceases to exist, or if the business relationship between Electropoli CZ and the Supplier is terminated, Electropoli CZ has the right to request the submission of all documents related to Electropoli CZ products.

Technical documentation

The Supplier must ensure that only valid documents specified in the contract are used. It is therefore necessary that the Supplier has implemented a suitable documentation management system.

Specifications, standards, drawings, etc. specified in our orders are binding, i.e. any questions as to whether submitted documents are valid and complete and any related open matters must be settled before the Supplier accepts an order.

All technological changes (products, drawings, etc.) must be monitored for the entire lifetime of the product at the production site of the Supplier.

Confidentiality

All documentation is confidential and may not be disclosed to third parties without the express written permission of Electropoli CZ.

Reliable Production and Delivery

Before accepting the order, the Supplier shall determine the capacities and resources needed to provide the services requested and shall take appropriate measures to ensure production capacity and ability to deliver throughout the duration of the project.

Delivery schedule

The delivery dates specified in Electropoli CZ's purchase order are binding and represent delivery dates to Electropoli CZ site.

If suppliers receive purchase orders, they act in accordance with Electropoli CZ General Purchase Conditions, which are part of the order. If there is a production disruption at the Supplier, for example due raw materials shortage, capacity problems, quality defects, production tool failures, supply chain breakdowns or force majeure, the Supplier shall immediately inform Electropoli CZ.

The Supplier will immediately agree with Electropoli CZ the appropriate measures and action plan to be implemented. The planned shutdown in the Supplier's or its subcontractors' sites will be discussed with Electropoli CZ in time to ensure the uninterrupted delivery of products.

If Electropoli CZ is not informed or not informed in time, the Supplier will be liable for any consequences of such delay. Electropoli CZ reserves the right to invoice the Supplier for any costs incurred due to pending orders.

First Expired – First Out (FEFO)

The FEFO principle must be followed throughout the manufacturing process, including product deliveries.

Delivery Documentation

The Supplier shall prepare the transport documents required for dispatch of the goods. The Supplier shall comply with the regulation of the recipient country and the exporting country.

Delivery Note – the required minimum information

- Recipient
- Order number
- Material number and name according to purchase order
- Quantity delivered
- Batch number
- Packaging information
- Number of partial delivery note (for partial delivery)
- Number of sample delivery note (for sample delivery)

Test Certificates and Special Test Reports

Inspection certificate according to DIN EN 10204/3.1 (See also paragraph 13.1.)

Incoming Goods Inspection

Electropoli CZ expects that, based on the quality assurance measures taken by its suppliers, the products supplied meet the specified requirements.

As a rule, the incoming goods inspection at Electropoli CZ is limited to verifying the quantity and identity of the ordered products – as a minimum the review of the transport documents – and visual inspection of any shipping damage or packaging damage.

The Supplier shall be immediately informed of any defects found during this inspection. Electropoli CZ will also immediately notify the Supplier of any defects found during the normal activities of the organization and the Supplier waives any right to object in this respect to the later notification of the defect. This does not affect any rights of Electropoli CZ towards the Supplier under warranty.

Limited lifetime products will only be accepted if the expiry date is indicated on the packaging. The Supplier shall promptly inform Electropoli CZ of the delivery of an expiring product.

Specific requirements

When selecting products, the Supplier specifies requirements to comply with all customer specifications and with health, safety and environmental legislation.

If the product specification has to be changed for technical or business reasons, the Supplier shall submit a written application for approval to Electropoli CZ, justifying such change. Changes can only be made based on a written approval of Electropoli CZ.

Certificates

The Supplier shall include inspection certificates according to DIN EN 10204 3.1 automatically with each delivery.

The Supplier shall include Safety Data Sheets according to Directive 91/155/EEC automatically with the first delivery or each time they are updated.

Environmental Requirements

IMDS

The Supplier shall enter sampling products into the IMDS portal and always have the current IMDS data for the products.

Hazardous Substances

The Supplier shall comply with all national, European and international laws and regulations for the use, registration etc. of substances, materials and products.

For imports into the European Economic Area, the Supplier shall comply with the requirements of Regulation 1907/2006/EC (REACH).

Process and Product Release

This chapter applies to product suppliers only, not the suppliers of services.

The Supplier shall always supply the first product samples/batch to Electropoli CZ for approval. These samples represent products that were produced under standard serial production conditions and using standard manufacturing/operating tools. Electropoli CZ will test these samples before the start of standard (serial) production to verify that all quality requirements have been met.

The quantity and specification of samples must be agreed in advance between the Supplier's representative and the Electropoli CZ Purchasing or Quality Department. Together with these samples, the Supplier shall provide documentation (according to VDA 2 or PPAP methodology, in its latest revision, or Supplier's own methodology).

The Supplier shall oblige its subcontractors to comply with the sampling procedures. The Supplier is not permitted to submit samples to Electropoli CZ until the subcontractor sampling procedure has been successfully completed and approved.

Reasons for submitting first samples:

- a) the first product order
- b) the change of subcontractor
- c) after the product change
- d) after supply disruption for more than one year
- e) after changing the manufacturing process
- f) after transferring production or using transferred machines or resources
- g) when using alternative materials

Initial Sample Evaluation/Transition to Serial Production

The Supplier shall send initial samples, including sampling documentation, to the Purchasing Department. After the initial samples inspection and the submission of relevant documents, Electropoli CZ will

- a) release the product, if all requirements are met;
- b) release the product with restrictions. In this case, the product may be delivered in limited quantities or for a limited period. The Supplier shall be informed of the reasons preventing the full release and an appropriate action plan shall be agreed;
- c) reject the product. The initial sample of the improved product shall be resubmitted together with the revised documentation within the period agreed with Electropoli CZ.

Serial production

The Supplier must not deliver the product until the initial samples are released.

The Supplier shall ensure that its products and products from its subcontractors consistently meet the quality requirements. To ensure this, the Supplier shall put in place appropriate control mechanisms for itself and its subcontractors.

The Supplier shall perform regular evaluations of its subcontractors (supplier audits).

Changes

Suppliers will provide detailed information about any changes to the product, manufacturing process, or relocation of the site (also internally). Changes can only be made based on a written approval of Electropoli CZ.

Supplier Change Request

The Supplier shall submit to the responsible person of the customer a written change request.

If the request is approved by Electropoli CZ, Purchasing Department will set out further detailed steps with the Supplier. The Supplier shall comply with this procedure also if the change is requested by a subcontractor, in which case the Supplier assumes the responsibility for coordinating the change process.

Changes made by Electropoli CZ

If a product or process change is required, due to new or additional requirements, Electropoli CZ will send a change request to the Supplier. The Supplier is responsible for notifying the relevant subcontractors of this change. The Electropoli CZ Purchasing Department will agree with the Supplier a detailed procedure for change implementation (new samples etc.).

Non-conformities and Complaints

Process Deviations

The Supplier shall notify Electropoli CZ of any process non-conformities that may lead to non-compliance with the terms and conditions set forth in the agreement with Electropoli CZ (threats to quality, delivery times, quantities etc.) and shall submit a corrective action plan. This is particularly important in cases where hidden product defects have been identified, which requires immediate action to avoid recurrence of the same defect.

The Supplier shall notify the customer of the following information:

- a) description of non-conformity
- b) possible impact on the product
- c) labelling of non-conforming products
- d) quantity of non-conforming products

Complaints to Supplier

In case of non-conforming deliveries or non-delivery of products/services, Electropoli CZ reserves the right to make a complaint to the Supplier.

The Supplier will be notified of complaints via a Complaint Report, which will include a description of the defect, a request for systematic resolution of the complaint using the 8D process, and a quantification of the initial, known costs.

Charged Costs

- a) issuing complaint – 2,500 CZK/100 €
- b) sorting at the customer (also if provided by an external company)
- c) the price of items intended for physical destruction
- d) handling, special transport, costs of customer inventory checks
- e) the penalization of customer in the event of line shutdown or JIT/JIS delivery failure

Responding to Customer Complaints

The Supplier shall perform 100% inspection of the first 3 deliveries following the complaint, mark each packaging with the "100% inspection" label and include the results of 100% inspection with the delivery.

The Supplier responds in the form of 8D report in the following timeframe:

- a) immediate measures – within 24 hours (one working day);
- b) root cause analysis, identification and implementation of corrective and preventive measures – within 10 working days;
- c) closing the complaint (implementation of corrective measures) – within 1 month

Escalation Process

In case of ongoing problems, repeated complaints about the same defect or large number of complaints in general, Electropoli CZ will initiate the escalation process.

Electropoli CZ will contact the supplier and request the submission of an action plan to eliminate any defects.

The Supplier undertakes to inform the customer at regular intervals about the status of corrective actions. Once all the defects have been rectified, the escalation will be terminated.

Verification of Preventive Measures

When the complaint is closed by the Supplier, Electropoli CZ reserves the right to audit the Supplier to verify the effectiveness of the measures taken.

Transport

The Supplier guarantees that the shipment will not be damaged during the standard delivery in accordance with the packing regulations. The Supplier is responsible for the suitability of the packaging.
